Drug Policy

This document is a statement of the aims, principles and strategies for drug education and drug related incidents at Leicester Preparatory School.

EDUCATION

The Drug policy should be read in conjunction with the Policy for Teaching and Learning as, together, these establish the general ethos of the school.

Aims

- To maintain the safety and well-being of all pupils.
- To develop a whole school approach to drug education in the context of the curriculum of the school.

Definition of a drug

A drug is a substance that affects the way in which the body functions physically, emotionally or mentally. This definition includes illegal substances and also legal substances such as: alcohol & tobacco, volatile substances, over the counter & prescription medicines.

Organisation

Drug education is delivered through the science curriculum. In addition, related work is covered in PSHE lessons.

DRUG RELATED INCIDENTS

In the event of finding drugs or related paraphernalia on the school premises or at school venues:

- The area is to be made safe (using cones from games cupboard) and a member of staff should remain with the article and stop anyone from handling it.
- Headmaster is alerted.
- Local authority contacted to arrange removal.
- Entry made in the school's incident book.
- Consideration is given at all times to the risks involved in asking pupils to clear litter given the potential hazards.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

In the event of a medical emergency alert the First Aider and follow procedures relating to drug situations.
